



Module 3: Multiply

3.1 Multiplying

In Excel, you can easily multiply numbers in cells, just as you would with a calculator.

You can do this by selecting the cell where you want the product to appear.

There are two important elements you cannot forget: First, it is important that you put the equals sign before the operation. Second, the sign to multiply is the asterisk (*). Place the asterisk between the two numbers or cell references you want to multiply, and press enter.

The second way to multiply numbers in Excel is by using the PRODUCT function in a formula. This is most useful when you have a lot of numbers to multiply or if you have ranges of numbers to multiply.

To use this, type the formula: **=PRODUCT(cell or range of cells1, cell or range of cells2)**

You can use as many inputs you would like for this function.
