

# **Module 42: ISTEXT Formula**

#### **42.1 ISTEXT Formula**

You can use the ISTEXT function in Excel to check whether a value in the cell is text based.

ISTEXT is part of the function group IS, that will return a value of TRUE or FALSE. ISTEXT will return a TRUE if the data in a cell is text, or FALSE if it is numeric, or is a formula that will offer a numeric outcome. You would use ISTEXT with a cell address to provide a value.

For example, if you wanted to check whether the value in cell B4 is text based, you would use ISTEXT and if the value is "seven" it will return a TRUE, if it is "7" it will return a false.

The formula is written as: **=ISTEXT(value)** With value being the value to check.
