



Module 47: OR Formula

47.1 OR Formula

The OR formula in Excel will allow you to check whether any of the conditions you have set in an argument are true.

If all the conditions are met, TRUE will be returned, and if not it will return a FALSE. You can use OR to check up to 255 conditions.

The formula is written as: **=OR(cell="logical1", cell="logical2")** logical1: The first condition to evaluate. logical2: The second (optional) condition to evaluate.

The OR formula is typically used in conjunction with an IF formula. You can use it to return a specific result, rather than just a TRUE or FALSE. The formula is written as: **=IF(OR(cell="logical1", cell="logical2"),"value1", "value2")** Value1 = The value to return if a logical condition is returned as TRUE Value2 = The value to return if a logical condition is returned as FALSE
