

Module 3 : Multiply

3.1 Multiplying

In Excel, you can easily multiply numbers in cells, just as you would with a calculator.

You can do this by selecting the cell where you want the answer to appear.

There are two important elements you cannot forget: First, it is important that you put the equals sign before the operation. Second, the sign to multiply is the asterisk (*). Place the asterisk between the two numbers or cell references you want to multiply, and press Enter.

To multiply: **=cell1*cell2** Or just insert the numbers directly in the cell, e.g: **=10*5** Press Enter.
