

Module 20 : DCOUNTA Function

20.1 DCOUNTA Function

The DCOUNTA function in Excel will count the cells in a column or database that are not blank.

DCOUNTA is part of the Database function group that performs basic tasks in a large field of data.

The formula is written as: **=DCOUNTA(database, field, criteria)**

Database - This is the range of cells that make up your database or list.

Field - This is the column that you want to return data from. You can either enter the column name between the quotation marks, for example "Name," or the column number, without quotation marks, such as 1. Keep in mind that this is optional with DCOUNTA. You can leave it blank to return results from the entire database.

Criteria - This is the cell range that contains the criteria you specify.
