

# Module 57: VLOOKUP with DropDown List

# 57.1 Vlookup with DropDown List

The ever-popular VLOOKUP can be used with a drop-down list to make it interactive.

By using the drop-down list as your lookup value, you will make VLOOKUP an even more powerful and effective formula. Furthermore, by using VLOOKUP with a drop-down list, you change your selection within the list and you will also change the VLOOKUP value.

The formula is written as: =VLOOKUP(lookup\_value, table\_array, col\_index\_num, [range lookup])

lookup value - The value we are looking up. This will be our drop-down list in this case.

table array - The table where our values are stored.

column index number - The column where our reference is stored.

range\_lookup - (Optional) This could be FALSE for an exact match, or TRUE for an approximate match.
